What is T.E.I.?

The Teacher Education Institute (T.E.I.) is named in honor of Alexander Lebenstein (OBM) a Holocaust survivor who was committed to Holocaust education through the sharing of his experiences in Nazi Germany.

The mission of T.E.I. is to assist educators with their understanding of the Holocaust and genocide. Sessions focus on historical background and pedagogy which link to the **Virginia Standards of Learning** requirements.

T.E.I. has grown from a weekend workshop to a two-week, multi-component course.
