Let The World Know: Teaching about the Nazis' LGBTQ+ Victims

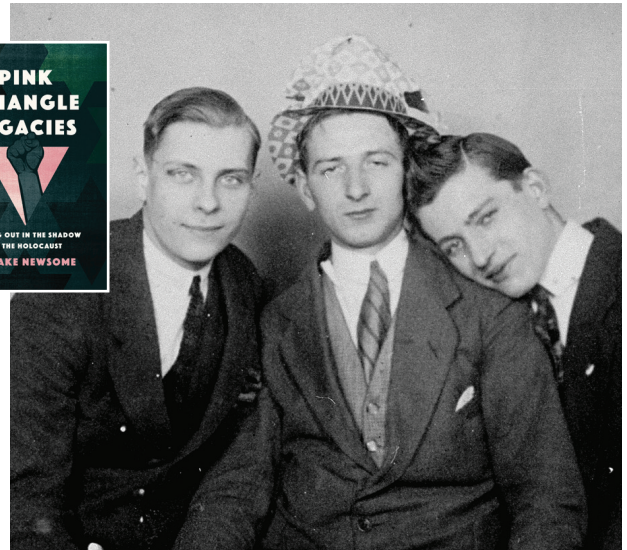

Join Virginia Holocaust Museum and Diversity Richmond for this workshop led by Dr. W. Jake Newsome Public Historian of the LGBTQ+ Past and author of the newly released book *Pink Triangle Legacies: Coming Out in the Shadow of the Holocaust*, as we discuss common questions,

challenges, and opportunities when teaching about the Nazi persecution of LGBTQ+ people. Topics include terminology, how to integrate this theme into the overarching narrative of Holocaust history, and the power of individual stories. Educators will receive an overview of the latest historical research on the topic and new educational resources, including a lesson plan, bibliography, and a copy of "Pink Triangle Legacies: Coming Out in the Shadow of the Holocaust." Dr. Jake Newsome is an award-winning scholar of German and American LGBTQ+ history whose research and resources educate global audiences.
